Using thick layers, expressive mark making and various mediums she allows stories to emerge from within images, sometimes unsettling, sometimes humorous. Alice's work sits between observation and imagination, with elements of traditional and personal folklores creeping in and juxtaposed with mundane realities. Having studied Celtic languages and literature, Alice draws on imagery from folklore of Britain and Ireland.

Recent works explore representations of animals, particularly in

their relationship with civilisation. In these works, animals work both as a symbol for the artist herself and for the brutalities of humanity, the violence inherent in modern life.





Alice Nguyen

Alice is a second generation Vietnamese-Australian. She has travelled across the world and is inspired by the places she has lived in. She is fascinated by how the natural landscape of each region can be so vastly unique but consistently beautiful.

When Alice finds herself in a new corner of the world, she seeks out the quiet forms of its nature. She surrounds herself in it, allowing its more unassuming aspects to convey its beauty to her.

This is evoked by her use of watercolours. The saturation and fluidity of her artworks are a reflection of her constantly shifting surroundings. The use of gold pigment is an expression of the joy that Alice feels when she finds that momentary sense of home.








Amjad Ali Talpur


Amjad Ali Talpur's artistic practice defies cursory, inattentive readings. Trained as a miniaturist, he inverts the very trope by staying true to scale but by creating a mosaic of small images in the form of actual, physical puzzles instead of reducing the scale of motifs within one monolithic image. This invites a relationship with his viewers, involving them in the questions of domestic, economic and social pressures that the artist engages with. As Talpur states " My work deals with the formal issues of making the possible views of the visuals. I enjoy the process of the work, randomness, playfulness and humour in my practice. This leads me to comment on the current situation of the society."





Amy Austin

Amy is an artist with a focus on storytelling, whether that's through the making of the image or the inspiration behind the work. Inspired by folklore, mythology, interior and exterior spaces Amy's work explores the female experience within different environments.



Asif Ahmed

"Miniature art itself is the subject of discussion in my work. Making of detail drawings and miniatures take a view of the historical period in the present time. Historical symbolism and figures has been a central theme of my surfaces and connection between the images are as a means to question about the position of traditional art and iconography. Borrowing of imagery from the pages of famous traditional schools and transforming them by juxtaposed, overlapped, and rearranged to construct new narratives. I use a mostly traditional miniature technique often on small or large scales, develop them gradually and put them into new contexts to articulate contemporary issues of traditional art in the modern world."





Ayman Monet

Ayman Qamar (under the signature name Ayman Monet) is a working Fine Artist, Illustrator and Writer based in Islamabad, Pakistan. She graduated with Honours, from National College of Arts in 2019 with a degree in BFA (Hons), majoring in Miniature Painting. Her work mainly revolves around stories, character designs and illustrations.

Her work has been exhibited online and at various places in Islamabad including The French Embassy, Pakistan National Council of Arts, Satrang Gallery and Fankaar Cafe. She is greatly inspired by the illuminated manuscripts of miniature, anime and comic books.





Bianca De Maio

'Although I have always considered myself as a painter, my artistic practice is based on experimentation in multiple fields and on the combination of different techniques. This is one of the reasons why the materials has always had a strong influence on my language. I always have had an intimate relationship with the beginnings which are able to give me a sense of accomplishment. My work in general is based on an empathy for the natural world, and, whatever technique I use, I could tell that what I do in my practice is basically an interpretation of reflections about the life around me. I have an innate attitude to realism, so it is important for me to start from the observation and study of models from life, but, on the other hand, I basically try to combine what is real and what is instead only at an imaginary stage. I could say that there are two types of energy which play in my work: one that is stable, design and crystallized, and one that is flexible and soft, or rather a transfiguration of reality which is based on a mental or physical state, and which alters the perception of what is observed. I believe that one of the fundamental aspects for me is to create objects that have a powerful expressiveness in them. The investigation into the communicative ability of the artistic object has perhaps always been my first concern, beyond the aesthetic results.'






Brendan Sullivan


> end goal other than hopefully intriguing someone enough to take even just an extra second to examine the details of any photograph or work of art.'






Elena Cara


Emma Jane Brassington

She has studied Oil Painting at Hokkaido Tanki Daigaku for Girls full time for three years before moving to London where she received a Diploma in Art and Design Studies at Sir John Cass School of Art, City of London Polytechnic, London UK. She has also studied Life Drawing at St Martins School of Art, London UK. She often gets the inspiration for her work from her inner child, daily life and people with shining life forces regardless of which kind of life state they might be in at the time, in the same way that the Moon and stars are illuminated by the Sun: the nature of the Universe.

My subject matter is Portraiture, human figures and birds specifically vultures and ravens in a surreal contemporary manner.





Jacob Darner

Jacob is 25 year-old artist living and working out of Michigan, USA. He mostly works through photography, using the natural beauty of his surroundings as a backdrop to the myriad of ideas flying around his head. In most cases this same natural beauty is the inspiration for his illustrations. When he can, he merges as many of these as possible to create art. Other inspirations are (art) history and pop culture, both of which he absorbs in ungodly amounts. Otherwise, he loves outdoors – hiking, and paddleboarding. Baking, watching footbal and organizing art shows for artists at local businesses in the USA.





Jeff Thomson

I've been painting for the last 15 years as it is my passion. I started tentatively using photographs as a reference, but over time found the copings process to restrictive. I kept finding myself trying to reproduce an exact copy. For me this is not what art is about. To really enjoy the process of producing a piece of art is about your inner being. It's about opening your mind feeling the energy through your fingers and letting go. Most of my more recent works have been painted in this way. I'm inspired by nature and the unknown. I believe in recycling so I'm always looking for discarded surfaces I can work with. I use a mix of decorating and artist brushes and scrapers to apply the paint. In general, I tend not to plan a painting, it's much more exciting just to go with flow with a blank canvas. As soon as the first brush stroke hits the canvas, I am off. I am never afraid of failure I can always start again. I trust my inner self and go for it'.





John Lyons

John is a photographer specialising in live music, live jazz and portrait photography. He lives in Durham in the Northeast of England but does much of his work in and around London. Over the last few years, he has taken photographs of some wonderful musicians at venues in London and New York. His photography conveys the passion and feeling behind the music rather than just a straight capture of the event or gig. A great music photographer needs to be in love with the music and able to anticipate and capture the expressive moments – capturing performers 'in the moment'. Many of his images are captured in small clubs where he aims to convey the intimacy and connection with the audience that comes with that environment. Earlier this year, John won the prestigious Live Music Photography Award in the Abbey Road Music Photography Awards, with a photograph of jazz drummer David Mrakpor, taken at the 606 Club in Chelsea. His influences include the famous jazz photographer Jean-Pierre Leloir, but also artists as diverse as Yousuf Karsh, Pennie Smith and Robert Mapplethorpe.



Kazunari Otsuka

I photograph the man-made objects that dot the coastline by greatly distorting them. Also, I background the sun and the sea as symbols of life. Their appearances, which are far from the originals, remind us of strange creatures.

Maisa Talvikki Tenhunen



Marco Waters








Sameeha Khaliq

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
Sayeda Umel Baneen

Seraaj Hoosain



With adding fixed elements to the scene, the story can be more interesting as some elements will be affected by time while others won't. Stephane's fine art long exposure is captured essentially on various black and white film stocks with neutral density filters, a medium format camera and Nikon 35mm cameras to create timeless images of time.

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Tasha Kotadia



Tina's work investigates emotional intensity, longing and nostalgia, currently exploring the interconnectedness of relationships in terms of Sustainability.






Umberto Moroni

Now fashions and social states no longer leave us our personality but tend to standardize us all. This depersonalization creates conflicts between ourselves and with others.

With this project I am presenting the interaction between the mannequins as if they were people in their everyday life, but with a critical vision. The mannequins (which represents people) are obsessively concerned with their outward appearance and status in society. This generates an inner conflict that leads to antagonism between the mannequins, The need to fit in destroys our individuality and uniforms our own personalities and this lack of individuality creates conflicts between ourselves and with others. In these images I am depicting these mannequins having a contentious connection between them that is at times friendly and other times corrosive and destructive.'








Victoria Kennaugh

Aye! is a singer, songwriter and electronic musician who was born in Japan and is based in London, UK.








Bushy










Marco Waters



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
Rita Tam




